

# How to Obtain a Unique Student Identifier (USI)

A **USI** is a mandatory, lifelong education number issued by the Australian Government. It is required for all students enrolling in nationally recognised training, including university, TAFE, and other vocational education providers.

## Why You Need a USI

#### You must have a USI to:

- Enrol in nationally recognised courses
- Access your training records and results
- Receive qualifications or statements of attainment
- Apply for Commonwealth financial assistance (e.g., HECS-HELP, FEE-HELP)
- Graduate from your coursE

### **Steps to Create Your USI**

#### **For Domestic Students**

- 1. Go to the USI Student Portal: <u>usi.gov.au</u> [Create you...Identifier]
- 2. Click "Create USI"
- 3. Provide Identification: Use one form of ID such as:
  - Australian passport
  - Birth certificate
  - Driver's licence
- 4. Enter Personal Details: Ensure your legal name matches your enrolment records.
- 5. **Set Up Your Account**: Use a personal email and create a secure password.
- 6. Receive Your USI: It will be displayed and emailed to you instantly.

## **Important Notes**

- You only need to create a USI once.
- Do not create multiple USIs.
- If you've studied in Australia before, you may already have a USI. You can retrieve it via the USI portal. [Create you...Identifier]
- Your USI must be provided during enrolment to avoid delays in accessing results or graduating.



# Tips to Be Prepared When Applying for Your USI

To make the process smooth and quick, follow these tips:

- Use your legal name: Ensure it matches your ID and enrolment records exactly.
- Have your ID ready: Accepted documents include:
  - ✓ Australian passport
  - ✓ Birth certificate
  - ✓ Driver's licence
  - ✓ Medicare card
  - ✓ Visa and foreign passport (for international students)
- Use a personal email address: Avoid using school or work emails to ensure long-term access.
- Choose a secure password: You'll use this to log in and retrieve your USI later.
- Record your USI safely: Save it somewhere secure or take a screenshot.
- Check for an existing USI: If you've studied in Australia before, you may already have one. Use the Find Your USI tool.
- Avoid duplicate USIs: Creating more than one can cause delays in accessing your records.
